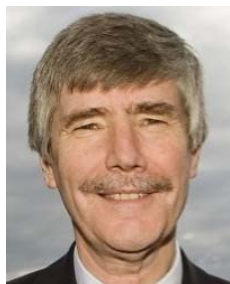


Paul KOFFEL (Chair) *BA LLB 1998*
